

The Islamic State of Iraq and al-Sham (ISIS) continues to concentrate its effort in the area of Balad in the northern Baghdad belt. Its offensive south of Balad has triggered a major response by the Iraqi Security Forces (ISF) and the Iraqi Shi'a militias within the Popular Mobilization Units (PMUs). The increased response by these forces indicates the seriousness of the situation and ISIS intent to disrupt the Baghdad-Samarra highway. ISIS is launching its attacks from the Yathrib sub-district, east of Balad, and is also forcing the ISF and PMUs to consolidate their effort south of Balad, closer to Baghdad. In the north, the Iraqi Kurdish Peshmerga and ISIS continue to clash in Kirkuk which is another sign that ISIS continues to engage the Peshmerga. The situation has resulted in a stalemate between the two forces, and ISIS attacks have been concentrated in southwestern Kirkuk. It will be important for the Peshmerga to watch for ISIS attacks in the northwestern parts of the province, including the areas of Dibis.
