

Prime Minister (PM) Haidar al-Abadi and Defense Minister Khalid al-Ubaidi have come under increasing pressure over the last three days. Political opponents have launched efforts to target both figures specifically regarding the government's management of the security portfolio. This criticism was based on a recent attack by ISIS that resulted in the seizure of an IA outpost in eastern Anbar. Official reports of casualties from MoD and the PM did not exceed 13 dead, but rumors have since suggested that over 100 ISF members may have been killed. Iraqi society has become acutely sensitive to events that result in the death of besieged ISF members, especially after the killing of hundreds of ISF members besieged in Camp Speicher following the fall of Tikrit in June 2014. Therefore, reports of a massacre in Thar Thar have provided a rallying point for critics of Abadi and Ubaidi. It is unlikely that this campaign will achieve substantial results, such the dismissal of the defense minister, but it does highlight that security is not the only challenge faced by the Abadi government.
